 - a. Jessica provided an overview of the ESG Program
 - i. There are four components to the program: a) 24/7 Shelter Services b) Rapid Rehousing c) homelessness prevention d) street outreach (if applicable)
 - b. For those agencies that have received ODOC's ESG, what is working?
 - i. Denise Phelps: Because we have few shelters in our rural area, using hotel/ motel vouchers is helpful. Also, the roundtable meetings. And Jessica and the ODOC staff are great.
 - ii. General consensus: Getting money to folks in need is quick, easy, and helpful for people who need it.

- iii. Jody: Without these funds, a lot of people/families would go back into abusive situations.
- iv. John Ann: Access to ODOC and staff is helpful; they're always very responsive
- v. Lindi: Application process and the differences between each year. Also, the uploads section of the app
- c. What is not working?
 - i. Lindi: As we grow, the same funding gets divided more ways. Jessica says the best way to demonstrate need is improving data and data quality in HMIS
 - ii. Jody: DV agencies are "stuck" with not having comparable DV databases. Jessica notes that yes, this is a critical problem.
 - iii. Jessica asked what could be a problem once ESG-CV funds go away? In total, it's just that there won't be enough money.
- d. What changes/solutions do you recommend to address what is not working?
 - i. For DV: Make OAG and HUD sit down at a couch until they get along. They're policies are conflicting, and it can make the work we do very difficult. Those who suffer the most are clients.
